A Supercross is a Horse Trials without the Dressage phase. Grading is as for Horse Trials. Normal Showjumping and Cross-Country penalties apply, plus a ride to time scoring system for Cross Country. An optimum time range will be allocated to Cross Country and penalties apply for over or under this time range. In the event of multiple riders in a class finishing without penalties, placings will be determined based on PCASA Supercross rules.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Entering this competition constitutes acknowledgement that PCASA rules apply and acceptance of these rules. PCASA rules may be found at [www.ponyclub.asn.au](http://www.ponyclub.asn.au).
- PC combinations must have 2 home qualifications obtained in the previous 12 months to compete
- No refunds after the closing date except with a vet or medical certificate. An admin fee of \$10 will be deducted. **Late entries may be accepted, subject to a \$20 late fee.**
- For PC riders, PCASA club member cards must be inspected at the secretary's shed before riding. **NO CARD NO RIDE.**
- For EA riders, the current 2025/26 EA membership card and jumping license (Open 95 and 105cm only) must be inspected at the secretary's shed before riding. EA riders must sign a waiver.
- Open classes are open to EA and PCASA State Adult members.
- Approved Helmets must be worn and must be no more than 5 years old. Helmets to be inspected at the secretary's shed prior to riding. PCASA Helmet tags accepted.
- Competitors may ride more than one horse.
- Gear check for PC and EA riders before riding in each phase of the competition is required.
- Medical armbands and body protectors with number holders must be worn by all competitors.
- Queries, horse abuse rules, etc, as per PCASA Handbook of By Laws.
- Competitor body numbers for Cross Country will be available for collection at the secretary's shed.
- Watches may be worn.
- Winners and Placegetters to be without mounts, **in full PC uniform, or open riders in show jump attire for presentations.**
- No stallions or rigs permitted on the grounds.
- Dogs are prohibited on the Cross Country course.
- At a competition, only the competitor may ride or lunge his horse or pony. The penalty for disobeying this rule is elimination.
- Protests must be in accordance with PCASA rules.
- No plaiting required.
- No day membership available.
- Competitors are asked to nominate a helper to assist with cross country jump judging. All jump judges are expected to attend a briefing at 8am under the verandah.
